Subject : Rapid and structural responses to the crisis situation facing the agricultural sector

Dear Commissioner, Dear Janusz,

At the last AGRIFISH Council meeting on 26 February, Member States expressed a strong desire to give a rapid and robust answer to the farmers' demonstrations that we have seen throughout the EU over the last weeks and months and therefore tabled numerous proposals.

As the President of this Council configuration, I urge the European Commission to propose a concrete roadmap for the measures presented by the Commission at the Council, both for the short term and mid to long term. This is important to give a tangible response to farmers, but also to organise the work of the Belgian Presidency of the Council.

Regarding the CAP, the exchange of views in the Council emphasised the need to act quickly on issues such as conditionality (including GAEC 1, 6, 7, 8), the frequency of controls, the coordination and the simplification of the management of CAP strategic plans.

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Member States clearly expressed their will to open the basic regulations of the CAP. The Presidency believes this should be initiated as quickly as possible and at the latest before the AGRIFISH Council of 26 Marchand in a targeted way, so that the modifications can take effect from 2025.

Also regarding the position of the farmer in the food chain, initiatives are expected from the Commission. Transparency, trading practices and a fair position should be in the heart of future actions. The Presidency urges the Commission to clarify the steps it intends to take, the instruments it foresees to use and the timeline it wants to adopt. Many Member States also voiced concerns regarding distortion of competition from imported products and the need for further support, other than state aid.

I trust that you share the concerns of the Council, that you are convinced of the necessity to bring both rapid and structural answers to the needs of farmers and that you will soon create clarity on the concrete steps the Commission intends to take.
